

## Keyhaven Harbour

## [1.9 miles / 3 km / 1-2 hours]


From the car park, turn left towards the sea. Cross the road and follow the gravel path to the T- junction at the sea wall and turn right. This lovely walk is along the top of the sea wall, built as a flood defence in the 1970s. The walk ends at a gate next to a flood gate across the narrow road which is liable to flooding.

Retrace your steps and carry straight on along the sea wall, following around the harbour and past the ferry terminal to Hurst Castle. The ferry runs every 20 minutes from 10am - 5pm. There is a 10cm (4inch) threshold at the terminal entrance and 3-4 steps down on the ferry itself.

To extend the walk cross the road and turn right into the narrow gravel path. Follow the harbour wall to the right, over the bridge and enter the Keyhaven Marshes nature reserve, via a gate with an accessible trombone latch. Apart from a short slope of 1:8, this is a level walk further along the sea wall.
